

Impressed by the scout's abilities, the race committee immediately scheduled a second race, which host Paolo Semeraro won in front of Swedish Thomas Oljelund, who had dropped from first to fifth and gained back up to second. Terry Neilson and Lasse Hjortnaes came in third and forth, preparing for better times to come, but Jörgen Lindhardtsen was at hand with a fifth, thus leading the joungsters after two races.











Per Arne Nilson leading all the way

Wednesday May 23rd brought sunny weather and a gentle breeze, not good enough for a Gold Cup by Italian standards. So the race was postponed for about an hour, untill the wind picked up to force 4. A windshift at the time of the start to the right caused a wooling at the boatend of the line and left Lasse Hjortnaes - who had tried it at the other end of the world - back in the sixties at the first mark. Several further shifts back and forth gave Lasse reason to make it finally to 13. The sole Norwegian hero Per Arne Nilson was up in front all the time, Lindhardtsen had his computer programmed properly and was second in the end, beating out Joaquin Blanco, who used to enjoy this position most of the time. Performing such, Jörgen increased his lead with 13.0 points over Lasse with 29.0.














On Thursday, May 24th, the left side was better at the 1st beat, although a right shift was expected by the experts. The first reach was very high, the second a run, requiring a relocation of the weathermark by 30° to the left. Terry Neilson, generally leading, had to let Thomas Schmid pass by on the run, but made it up to the lead again on the final beat. Russel Coutts proved his nomination for the Games and came in third. Lindhardtsen managed to finish 10th and thus was still leading overall with 29.0, while Terry Neilson was second holding 56,7. Lasse Hjortnaes was nowhere for his standards in that race and dropped back to fifth overall. In the evening there was the IFA dinner with the usual food rocketing between some tables. The race committee took notes.



Above left: Tight situation at the gybe mark







Those disqualified in the fifth race under the five minute rule.



Friday May 25th the tension built up. Because of the fun the previous day, some sailors gave it too much of a try, causing a sequence of General Recalls.

The five minute rule did not cool down their spirits, thus the race committee disqualified a number, generally the keenest gunners of the previous days dinner. Larry Lemieux

obviously is getting old, since he does not show up in the list of those disqualified but as the winner of that race, while smart Mark Neeleman was second and Lasse third. Poor Lindhartsen got timid, worrying about the bad behaviour of his mental sons, and finished 22nd, thus lost the lead to Terry Neilson. Considering a discard, Terry had 23.7 points against 29.0 of Jörgen.

Saturday May 26th there was strong wind as most of the time in that memorable week with little shifts. Lemieux got going and was leading all the race followed by Russell Coutts. Lasse Hjortnaes finished third outsting Terry Neilson from the lead, who only managed to come home 10th. The difference of Lasses 39.4 to Terrys 39.7 promissed tight racing next day in the last race. Lindhardtsen, who had been leading for four races, finished 20th, had gathered 55,0 points but was still third overall and ahead of Larry Lemieux with 62. After a poor beginning the Canadian legend had won two races. He had found some water in his double bottom, which gave him reason to claim, that he had an unfair disadvantage. Thomas Schmid with four results in the top ten cought a PMS, missed his chance to improve and had to take a 25th in his results.


